SEA TURTLE CONSERVATION

The Recovery Plan for Marine Turtles in Australia (2017 - 2027) identifies Gnaraloo Bay as nesting habitat which is critical to the survival of loggerheads of the southeast Indian Ocean regional management unit (RMU). The southeast Indian Ocean RMU is among the least well-studied RMUs. Vital information on loggerhead turtle reproductive biology in this region is lacking, including nesting census data from key rookeries, which makes the Gnaraloo data important.

The Gnaraloo Turtle Conservation Program (GTCP) investigated and identified via scientific method the importance of a critical nesting area for endangered sea turtles, located in a world heritage area.




